# POSTPONED REQUIAR MENTING OF THE JERSET VILLAGE CITY COMMENTS. JERSET VILLAGE, TEXAS JANUARY 24, 1969

The meeting convened at 7:40 PM with the following present: Paul H. Dixon., Jr., Mayor, R. J. Adam, Jason Curtiss, P. A. Curfman, W. T. Danes, Kay de Geus, Aldermen and E. L. Schmals, Treasurer, Betty Rominger, Secretary.

On motion by Mr. Curfman, seconded by Mr. Curtiss, and carried, the minutes of the previous meeting were approved with correction as noted. Mr. Schmals presented the Treasurer's report and bills paid for the month ending December 31,1968 which were approved on motion by Mr. Curfman, seconded by Mr. Adam and carried. Mr. Schmals reported that 60 percent of taxes have been sellected. The Mayor asked Mr. Schmals to prepare a monthly tabulation of taxes collected this year and to set up a table next year showing taxes collected so that a comparison can be made of the percent of collection with the previous year.

Hayer Dixon reported that by decision of Hiss de Gous and Hr. Wall the garbage collection days have been changed to Wednesday and Saturday for Shanghai Street and around the lake and Tuesday and Friday on Jersey Dr. and Acapulco.

Fire Commissioner Curtiss said that James Smith had been asked to be Fire Chief and had accepted. On metion by Mr. Curtiss, seconded by Mr. Adam, and carried, the Mayor's appointment of James Smith as Fire Chief was approved.

Discussion following was on the proposed let line change in the soming ordinance. Attorney Adam said the resolution passed on 1st reading last meeting was probably not legal. The matter should be referred to the Zeming Commission who would have a hearing and bring their recommendations to Commell. Then Commell should held a hearing on the matter of the change. He said it was too soon to pass such a resolution. Mr. Adam said he had talked to Mr. O'Donnell of Suburban Homes Realty informing him of the restrictions and also of the necessity of getting all homesomers to sign a position approving the change. Hr. Adam and Mr. Wall have assured Mr. O'Donnell of their cooperation as far as knocking on doors, etc. to get the signers. Mr. Adam recommended that the matter be tabled until Suburban Homes decides what they intend to de. It is Mr. Adam's opinion that the action taken by Council at the last meeting should not be pursued further. He also reported that Mr. Haselwood had been filed on for non-payment of taxes.

Mayor Dixon informed the members of Mr. C. W. Dunham's appearance in regard to fireworks in the Village. Mr. Dunham said they were a fire hazard and a several had been thrown on his porch. He asked that Council consider an ordinance against fireworks in the Village. Mr. Adam felt that there was not enough public interest in such an ordinance, as did the other members although if one could be enforced it would probably be good. Mr. Curfman made the motion that a referendum be included at the next election. Motion died for lack of a second. Mayor Dixon will tell Mr. Dunham the general opinion of Council is that such an ordinance would be ineffective and not enforceable. He will inform him of the need to get a petition if he wishes to pursue the matter further.

The Hayor read a letter from the Texas Highway Department saying that a traffic and engineering investigation had been completed at US 290 intersection with Senate Drive and the study results indicate that there is insufficient traffic demand at the present time to warrant the construction of a deceleration lane. The Hayor will write again in a few months. He also read a letter from the Houston Galveston Area Council asking for the Village's membership in the amount of \$100.00. On motion by Mr. Adam, seconded by Mr. Curtiss, and carried, the matter was tabled.

The Mayor suggested that a Sales Tax vote be included in the April election. Mr. Adam will shock the method of doing this.

Mayor Mixon also read a letter from Parker Brothers & Co., Inc. reporting that in compliance with Ordinance #57 they propose the impreventants of Acapulco Drive from Carlebad east to Squate Brive and Juneau Lane from Acapulco Drive east to Jersey Drive.

On botion by Mr. Curfman, Seconded by Mr. Adam, and carried, it was MRSGLVED, that an election be held on the 5th day of April, 1969 at the City Hall in the incorporated City of Jersey Village for the purpose of electing a Mayor and two (2) Alderman (Positions #2 and #3) in accordance with the provisions of Chapter II, title 25, revised Civil Statutes of Texas, 1925 as amended.

And also that notice of such election be posted in three (3) places within the boundaries of the City of Jersey Village, Texas at least thirty (30) days prior to the election.

The deadline for filing is prior to March 5, 1969.

Mr. Wall brought up the matter of the need for a plumbing code. He presented such a code to Council. Mr. Adam suggested that the matter be tabled until a reputable builder could look at the code as they would have to live with it. This was allright with Miss de Geus if there was a time limit. Mayor Dixon appointed a committee of Mr. Wall and Miss de Geus to discuss the code with a builder and a plumber.

On motion by Miss de Geus, declaring an emergency, seconded by Mr. Danes, it was

RESOLVED, That Ordinance #66, An Ordinance repealing all ordinances, or parts of ordinances, or amendments thereto, that conflict with the terms or conditions of this ordinance and enacting in lieu thereof a new ordinance, regulating plumbing work in the City of Jersey Village, Texas; defining certain terms; providing for certain exemptions; providing for the enforcement of this ordinance and the issuance of permits and establishing certain fees; providing for specifications, materials and methods of plumbing installations; providing penalties for violation of this ordinance; providing a severability clause, be adopted.

The motion carried and the ordinance adopted on an emergency basis. Mr. Adam voted No. Mr. Curtiss voted No. Miss de Geus, Mr. Curfman, Mr. Danes voted Yes.

Miss de Geus reported on duplication machines and there was discussion on the matter of the City's need.

Meeting adjourned on motion by Mr. Curfman, seconded by Mr. Curtiss, and carried, at 9:10 PM.

### REGULAR SESSION OF THE JERSEY VILLAGE CITY COUNCIL, JERSEY VILLAGE, TEXAS February 17, 1969

The meeting convened at 8:11 PM with the following present: W. T. Danes, Mayor Pro Tem, R. J. Adam, Jason Curtiss, Kay de Geus, Aldermen and E. L. Schmalz, Treasurer, Setty Rominger, Secretary and the following absent: Paul H. Dixon., Jr., Mayor, P. A. Curfman, Alderman.

The reading of the minutes of the previous meeting were dispensed with and they were approved on motion by Miss de Geus, seconded by Mr. Curtiss, and carried.

Mr. Schmalz presented the Treasurer's report and bills paid for the month of January which were approved on motion by Mr. Curtiss, seconded by Miss de Geus, and carried. (Attached hereto and made a part of these minutes).

In regard to the Plumbing Code, Miss de Geus reported that Mr. Wall had talked to Mr. T. L. Blalock and Bill Wilke and they have no objection to such a code. Mr. Halock will serve as a director if necessary and is in favor. It is a production to the builder. Motion was made by Miss de Geus, seconded by Mr. Curtiss, and carried, that discussion of the Plumbing Code adoption be tabled until the next meeting.

Mr. Adam presented an ordinance ordering a special election on the question of the adoption of a sales tax. He said this ordinance needed to be passed not less than 30 or more than 90 days before the election. If passed, it should be sent to Austin, the results certified with the Controller's office. It will be a full quarter before the City will receive benefits from the tax, September or October. Mr. Curtiss asked if the amount received would be on gross sales or per capita. Mr. Schmalz said he was pretty sure it would be on gross sales but he would check. Mr. Curtiss and Miss de Geus were in favor of letting the citizens vote. Mr. Adam also wanted to know the approximate amount the City would receive. Mr. Schmalz will call the establishments in the City and ask about their sales.

On motion by Miss de Geus, seconded by Mr. Curtiss, it was
RESCLVED, That Ordinance No. 67, An Ordinance ordering a special election to be held
in the City of Jersey Village, Texas, on the question of adoption of a one percent(1%)
local sales and use tax within the City; designating the day of the election and the
polling place (s); appointing election officals therefor; providing that all duly
qualified resident electors shall be qualified to vote; prescribing form of ballot;
providing for notice of election; containing other provisions relating to said election;
providing for severability; and declaring an emergency, be adopted.
Motion carried on an emergency basis unanimously.

Mr. Danes read a letter from the Democratic Party asking the use of the City Hall as a polling place the balance of 1969 and all of 1970. Mr. Curtiss made the motion that they be given the use of the Hall. Motion died for lack of a second. There was discussion as to whether or not the Republican Party might also want use of the Hall and as to fair use by both parties. Mr. Curtiss made the motion, seconded by Miss de Geus, and carried, that the matter be tabled. Mr. Wall was instructed to call John Hanley, the Republican representative in the City to see if the Republican Party wanted to use the Hall.

Miss de Geus said Wallace Patrick had asked the Council's oppinion of him using the parking lot at the Entrance for a camper rally some time in April. Miss de Geus did not want to set a precedent for this type of rally. It is not known exactly what such a rally would entail. The campers would stay over-night and it is a promotional campaign. Mr. Curtiss made the motion, seconded by Miss de Geus, and carried, that the matter be tabled until such time as more definite information can be obtained.

Tom Martin, 1580l Acapulco, appeared concerning the "No Parking Signs" on his street and tickets he has received. He has five cars and no place to park them than on the street as they will not all fit on his driveway. He cannot get rid of the extra cars at this time yet did not want to keep receiving tickets. Miss de Geus said Mr. Wall and the Police Commissioner had authority to move signs if necessary. They were instructed to re-evaluate the situation and see if the signs should be moved. They will advise Mr. Martin as to what if anything can be done. Mr. Martin also wanted to know what to do about the tickets he had received. He was instructed to talk to the Judge; Shelly Hancock, about them, explaining the situation.

Mr. Cantale, President of the Civic Club, appeared to complain about boys shooting 22 rifles around the Lake. He is willing to file a complaint if necessary. He also asked about the City's Certificates of Deposit, Gas Well Taxes, and regulation of firearms in the City. He was given answers by Mayor Pro Tem Danes. The Certificates earn  $5 \ 1/4\%$  interest, the gas well taxes are not due yet and there is an ordinance against firearms.

Mr. Curtiss reported that I. F. Dickey, 15501 Shanghai, had complained about water coming across his yard when it rained. He wanted to know what could be done about it. There is a ditch in back of the houses to carry water off but it has filled up. Wr. Wall said it would take about \$100 to dig the ditch out to alleviate the condition. Mr. Curtiss made the motion, seconded by Miss de Geus, and carried, that Mr. Wall look into the matter and see if the ditch can be dug out for a cost not to exceed \$100; if it can be done, than Mr. Wall is to have the job done.

The reading of the Treasurer's report and approval of bills was tabled until arrival of Mr. Schmalz.

Under old business the Mayor brought up the discussion of the Plumbing Code. It was decided that discussion was not necessary at this time.

Mayor Dixon said he had received a letter from John Hanley requesting the use of City Hall as a polling place for the Republican Party. Mr. Adam suggested rotating use of the Hall. After discussion, Mr. Danes made the motion, seconded by Miss de Geus, and carried, that having considered the two letters (one from the Democratic and one from the Republican Party), that the Republican Primary Election in May and June, 1970 be held at the City Hall and the next year the Democratic Election be held at the City Hall. The representatives of the Parties will be informed of the decision.

Mr. Schmalz arrived and presented the Treasurer's Report and List of Bills Paid for the Month Ending February 28, 1969. He also gave each member a statement of various bank accounts of the City and a survey taken regarding the amount of Sales Tax paid last quarter 1968 by business establishments in the City. (All statements attached hereto and made a part of these minutes). Motion was made by Mr. Adam, seconded by Mr. Danes, and carried, that the bills be approved and the reports accepted.

As there has been no further information concerning the camper rally which was brought up at the last meeting, the matter was tabled.

Mr. Wall said relocation of the "No Parking Signs" would not help Mr. Tom: Martin, 15801 Acapulco, as the signs apply to the entire block. He also reported that it had been too wet to dig the ditch to alleviate the water condition on Shanghai.

The Mayor said he had received the usual letter from HL&P outlining their annual report as of December 31, 1968. Also, he had received a letter of the Harris County Delegation requesting Council's ideas on how to improve City Government.

Mr. Cantele, President of the Civic Club, appeared and asked if there was a need for a Sales Tax in the City and also who it was going to affect. Mr. Adam suggested that sales tax information be mailed to each citizen by Mr. Cantele. The City will receive approximately \$550 per quarter. At the invitation of the Civic Club, Councilman Danes will appear at the next Civic Club meeting to tell the citizens about the Sales Tax.

The meeting adjourned on motion at 8:10 PM.

The canvass of the results of the City election of April 5, 1969 was held and the results received are as follows: Mayor: Paul H. Dixon, Jr., - 100 votes

On motion by Mr. Adam, seconded by Mr. Curtiss, and carried, the results of the election for Mayor and two aldermen, positions #2 and #3, and the adoption of a Sales Tax for Jersey Village, Texas held on the 5th day of April, 1969 were adopted and approved. (Resolution and order canvassing returns and declaring results attached hereto and made a part of minutes Mr. Adam, City Attorney, swore in Paul H. Dixon, Jr. as Mayor, W. T. Danes as Alderman Position #2 and T. A. Willbern, Jr. as Alderman, Position #3. They were welcomed to Council and congratulated on their election.

On motion by Mr. Adam, seconded by Mr. Danes, and carried, the minutes of the previous meeting were approved as written.

Mr. Schmalz presented the Treasurer's report and bills paid during the month of March (copy attached hereto and made a part of these minutes.) They were approved on motion by Mr. Curtiss, seconded by Mr. Willbern, and carried.

Mayor Dixon made the following appointments:

- T. P. Wall Executive Assistant to the Mayor, Director of Public Works including all the duties he has had up to this time, and Corporation Court Clerk, at the same salary.
- R. J. Adam City Attorney at the same salary.
- Betty Rominger Part time City Secretary and Assistant Deputy to the Court at the salary.
- W. T. Danes Mayor Pro tem, Judge of Corporation Court with Mayor Dixon as Assistant, and in charge of public relations. Chairman of Tax Equalization Board.
- Kay de Geus Director of Utilities, including water, sewer, garbage, streets and previous duties.
- Jason Curtiss Fire Commissioner and in charge of Civil defense, parks and building repair and raintenance, also Public Service Director.
- T. A. Willbern, Jr. Police Commissioner, duties including organization and training of new officers, also in charge of city planning including zoning and deed restrictions, Chairman of the Zoning Commission. He was asked to check the job of Police Chief in the matter of performance and change if need be. He has the responsibility of the reappointment of T. P. Wall as Day Lieutenant and will look into the hiring of a night patrolman and give a report to Council within two months. Also, he was given the responsibility of hiring or firing the dog catcher and considering how this service might be improved.

Mr. Wall had not yet gotten a cost estimate on digging the ditch behind the houses on Shanghai.

Mr. Curtiss asked what had been done about the "No Parking" signs on Acapulco. Mr. Adam said the signs must say from "a certain point to a certain point No Parking" or they are not legal. Mr. Curtiss said the signs were up and should be enforced or taken down. Mr. Wall will see about placing a sign below the existing signs stating exact points of no parking. Mayor Dixon brought up the matter of people not stopping at the stop sign at Senate and Acapulco going toward Hempstead. Discussion followed on ways to stop this practice. It would be necessary for a patrolman to see the violator and get the license number to ticket him. Mayor Dixon also suggested that the City's 30 MPH sign be placed closer to Acapulco. Mr. Wall will take care of this.

The meeting adjourned on motion by Mr. Corres, seconded by Mr. Willbern, and carried at 9:15 PM.

The meeting convened at 7:40 PM with the following present: Paul H. Dixon, Jr., Mayor, Jason Curtiss, W. T. Danes, Kay de Geus, T. A. Willbern, Aldermen and E. L. Schmalz, Treasurer, Betty Rominger, Secretary and the following absent: R. J. Adam, Alderman.

On motion by Mr. Curtiss, seconded by Mr. Willbern, and carried, the minutes of the last meeting were approved as written with correction as noted. Mr. Schmalz presented the Treasurer' report, List of Bills Paid for the Month Ending April 30, 1969, and Revenue - Budgeted - Actual Report for approval. (Attached hereto and made a part of these minutes) On motion by Miss de Geus, seconded by Mr. Curtiss, and carried, the bills were approved and the reports accepted.

Mayor Dixon appointed the Budget Committee on which he will also serve, of Mr. Schmalz, Miss de Geus and Mr. Wall. This Committee will meet June 11, 1969 at 6 PM at Mr. Schmalz's office. Mr. Schmalz will ask Mr. Pechacek to submit a proposal for the annual audit before the June 11th budget meeting date.

Mr. Curtiss asked about the ditch behind Shanghai but it has been too wet for anything to be done about it as yet.

Police Commissioner Willbern reported that after attending the Mayor's and Councilman's meeting and discussing the matter with others, he felt it would be impossible to find someone qualified to be a full-time night patrolman at a cost the City could afford at this time. He said the City of Burgerville was willing to pay one half the cost if the patrolman would drive through three times a day or night. He made the following suggestions for consideration: giving the patrolman \$5.00 a night for the hours 12 thru 4 PM; \$8.00 for Friday, Saturday and Sunday, \$15.00 to drive through Burgerville three times. Mr. Willbern made the following recommendations for the Jersey Village Police Department:

- 1. That all police officer's commissions prior to May 1, 1969 be voided. Adopted on motion by Mr. Willbern, seconded by Mr. Danes.
- 2. That James Smith be appointed Police Chief. Adopted on motion by Ir. Willbern, seconded by Miss de Geus.
- 3. That Buddy Wall be Appointed Special Officer Day Lieut. Adopted on notion by Mr. Curtiss, seconded by Mr. Danes.
- 4. That Shelly Hancock be appointed Special Officer. Adopted on motion by Mr. Danes, seconded by Mr. Curtiss.
- 5. That R. J. Howe, L. C. Jander, J. O. Graham, and George Cummings be appointed police officers (Active). Adopted on motion by Mr. Willbern, seconded by liss de Geus.
- 6. That instructors for the three workshops planned, be paid a sum of ten (10) dollars each. Adopted on motion by Mr. Willbern, seconded by Mr. Curtiss to be charged to Acc. \$510.
- 7. That the secondary two-way communications set be installed in T. A. Willbern's home. Adopted on motion by Mr. Willbern, seconded by Mr. Curtiss to be charged to Acc. #503.

Police Commission Willbern said there would be three classes of officers, Active, Inactive, and Special. He intends to get someone from the Highway Department, the District Attorney's office and the Houston Police Department to conduct the workshops.

Ir. Willbern reported that the dog catcher, Ir. Tarfield, said he would come to Jerney Village three times a month plus any time Mr. Wall called him, We recommended that Wr. Arfield be retained on the same basis as before and Council gave its approval.

Mayor Dixon swore in R. J. Towe, J. C. Graham and George Cummings as police officers (Active) and they were congratulated on their joining the Department.

At Mr. Danes' suggestion, Mr. Willbern was commended by Council for a fine report.

The Mayor read the following letters: from Mr. Shelly Hancock saying he had joined the firm of Adam and Adam; from Drew Insurance Co. advising that DeWitt Logue was no longer with them; from Houston Natural Gas regarding a public hearing to be held on June 9, 1969 regarding a 37.7 cent Pipe Line distribution gate rate.

Mayor Dixon read a letter from Ruth Patrick, Judge of Precinct \$74, requesting higher salaries for election officials, stating that the County pays \$30 to the Judge, \$25 to assistant judges and \$22.50 to clerks and the School pays \$17.00 to Judges and \$15.00 to clerks. Mayor Dixon recommended that Jersey Village raiseits salaries for election officials. After discussion, it was decided that Mr. Willbern check on the School as to why they do not pay as much as the County and consolidate his information with any Mr. Adam may have and come back to the next meeting with a recommendation to Council.

Mr. C. W. Dunham, 15609 Shanghai, appeared before Council in regard to firecrackers in the City and requested an ordinance against the shooting of them. #### September 15, 1969

The meeting convened at 7:35 PM with the following present: Paul H. Dixon, Jr., Mayor R. J. Adam, W. T. Danes, Kay de Geus, T. A. Willbern, Aldermen and E. L. Schmalz, Treasurer, Betty Rominger, Secretary and the following absent: Jason Curtiss, Alderman.

On motion by Mr. Danes, seconded by Miss de Geus, and carried, the minutes of the previous meeting were approved as written.

John R. Pechacek, C.P.A., presented the Audit Report For Fiscal Year Ended June 30, 1969 for the City of Jersey Village for consideration and discussion and answered any questions the Council had. He said it was the best report the City has had so far in its history. Mayor Dixon commended Mr. Pechacek on presenting the report on time. Mr. Pechacek also said he would like to have the contract for auditing the City's booksfor the next year.

Mr. Schmals presented the Bills Paid during the Month of August and Revenue-Budgeted-Actual as of August 31, 1969 for Council approval. (Attached hereto and made a part of these minutes) On motion by Miss de Geus, seconded by Mr. Willbern, and carried, the reports were approved.

City Attorney Adam said that Mr. Willbern should call a meeting of the Zoning Committee and go over the soning ordinances and resolutions in order to call a public hearing on them in the future.

Mr. Willbern reported that the Zoning Committee had decided that small storage houses (such as those purchased at Sears) would be allowed as long as they were neat and not used as warehouses.

## REGULAR SESSION OF THE JERSEY VILLAGE CITY COUNCIL, JERSEY VILLAGE, TEXAS & BOARD OF EQUALIZATION MEETING

October 20, 1969

The Board of Equalization met at 7PM with W. T. Danes, Chairman, presiding and the following present: Paul H. Dixon, Jr., Jason Curtiss, T. A. Willbern, E. L. Schmalz, Betty Rominger and the following absent: R. J. Adam, Kay de Geus. The meeting adjourned at 7:25 PM on motion by Mr. Dixon, seconded by Mr. Curtiss, and carried. The Council meeting convened with Paul H. Dixon, Jr., Mayor, Jason Curtiss, T. A. Willbern, W. T. Danes, Kay de Geus, aldermen, E. L. Schmalz, Treasurer, Betty Rominger, Secretary, present. R. J. Adam was absent.

The minutes of the previous meeting were approved as written on motion by Mr. Danes, seconded by Mr. Willbern, and carried.

The Treasurer's report and bills presented were approved on motion by Miss de Geus, seconded by Mr. Curtiss, and carried. There was discussion of delinquent taxes. Mayor Dixon suggested that Mr. Adam write a letter to delinquent taxpayers in an effort to obtain payment. He dictated a letter to be sent to Mr. Adam asking him to do this.

Discussion followed on the adoption of a fireworks ordinance. Mayor Dixon favored the Houston erdinance. Mr. Curtiss said he was in favor of a modified ordinance limiting the time of shooting fireworks, perhaps prohibiting after 10 PM and until 7 AM the following morning and that if an ordinance could not be enforced we should not have one. However, any ordinance should be tied into parent responsibility. Mr. Curtiss would not like to see a complete shut-down of fireworks but public displays in the Park would be satisfactory to him. Mr. Willbern said it would be difficult to enforce the ordinance and that responsibility should rest with the parent. A citizen would have to file against the person violating the ordinance in order for a penalty to be imposed. Mayor Dixon suggested a \$200 fine on any person including a minor child for damage caused by fireworks if this was legal.

Mr. Danes was in favor of an ordinance prohibiting all fireworks and sales but allowing public displays. Miss de Geus agreed with him.

Mr. Curtiss made the metion that no fireworks be permitted to be shot off between the hours of 10 PM and 7 AM any day in the year with the exception of the night of July 4th and the night of New Year's Eve, except for public displays. The motion died for lack of a second.

Declaring that an emergency exists, Mr. Danes made the motion, seconded by Miss de Geus, that the City of Jersey Village adopt an ordinance similar and equal to the City of Houston's ordinance which includes a provision for public displays and prohibits the sale of fireworks. Mr. Curtiss voted "No"; Mr. Willbern abstained; Miss de Geus voted "Yes"; Mr. Danes voted "Yes". Motion was carried and ordinance adopted on an emergency basis. A letter will be written to City Attorney Adam instructing him to prepare this ordinance.

Mayer Dixon read a letter from County Clerk R. E. Turrentine, Jr. regarding "Posting Notices of Meetings of Governmental Bodies." A letter will be written to City Attorney Adam instructing him to review and advise what action should be taken.

Shelly Hancock said several clubs in the area wanted to incorporate and did not want the City of Houston to take them in. They thought that perhaps Jersey Village could take the. The City cannot do this since at our present size we are only allowed to take in one-half mile.

Mr. Willbern said the election clerks' salaries passed by Council do not conform with the State Election Code. He will review and inform Council of changes needed.

Mr. Willbern brought up the matter of a Police Training School he would like to set up (copy of content attached). He also informed council of the money he would like to spend on winter uniforms as well as on the school. Approval was given in these matters.

Miss de Geus said Sanitary Refuse System wanted to increase their fee as of November 1st from \$3.25 to \$4.25. She felt the increase was too much but said the City could not pessibly go back into the garbage business at this time. Mayor Dixon suggested the possibility of incinerators now in use which are non-poluting. It was concluded that at this time there is no choice but to accept the Sanitary Refuse System's contract. Miss de Geus recommended that the City negotiate the contract for one year. Mayor Dixon recommended that the amount be approved and that Miss de Geus be chairman of a committee to look into some solution of the problem. She will choose the members of her committee.

Mr. Willbern made the motion, seconded by Miss de Geus, that the City accept the contract for that amount (\$4.25 a month each house) for one year with the provision that Council through a committee headed by Miss de Geus look for a better solution and the provision that the City have an option after six months to terminate the contract. Motion carried.

The meeting adjourned at 9:15 PM.

# REGULAR SESSION OF THE JERSEY VILLAGE CITY COUNCIL, JERSEY VILLAGE, TEXAS November 17, 1969

The meeting convened at 7:35 PM with the following present: Paul H. Dixon, Jr., Mayor, R. J. Adam, Jason Curtiss, Kay de Geus, T. A. Willbern, Councilmen and E. L. Schmalz, Treasurer, Betty Rominger, Secretary. W. T. Danes, Councilman, was absent.

The minutes of the previous meeting were approved with correction as noted on motion by Mr. Curtiss, seconded by Mr. Willbern and carried.

Mr. Willbern reported that salaries adopted for election officials did not conform to the new Election Code. The maximum pay under the amendments to the Texas Election Code enacted by the 61st Legislature of Texas at its session in 1969 is \$2.00 per hour. Mr. Willbern recommended \$1.50 per hour to be paid one hour before and two hours after the polls close. Motion was made by Mr. Willbern, seconded by Mr. Curtiss, and carried, that Jersey Village adopt the method of paying election officials as outlined in the foregoing act of the Texas Legislature under Article 3.08, Section 4 of the Texas Election Code, paying \$1.50 per hour. (\$18.00 for clerks; \$23.00 for Judge plus \$5.00).

Mr. Willbern reported that the police training school was going well. In regard to the policing of Burgerville, Mr. Willbern suggested that Buddy Wall might be able to cruse through the area. The homeowners are willing to pay \$2.00 per house each month for this service. Miss de Geus was against Mr. Wall doing this because: (1) he already has enough work to do, (2) he detests police work although he will do it if asked to, (3) if something should happen, the City would be without a public works director. Mr. Willbern knew of others who would be willing to make the runs. Mayor Dixon said the payment of gas used should come out of any money collected. Mr. Willbern made the motion that this service be performed with the City receiving \$10 of the money collected or enough for gas and expenses and the rest to go to the patrolman who performs the service. Motion was seconded by Miss de Geus. Vote was as follows: Mr. Adam - Yes, Miss de Geus - Yes, Mr. Willbern - Yes, Mr. Curtiss - No. Motion carried.

Mr. Schmalz presented the Treasurer's report and the delinquent tax roll. (Coppes attached hereto). Bills were approved for payment on motion by Mr. Willbern, seconded by Mr. Curtiss and carried.

Discussion followed on the Fireworks Ordinance adopted on an emergency basis at the last meeting. Mayor Dixon said that at the last meeting he was not in favor or against such an ordinance but if one was passed the City of Houston's was the best guide presented. Mr. and Mrs. W. L. Patrick appeared to protest the ordinance, saying that fireworks would be sold down the road if not sold in Jersey Village and that many people moved here to give their children the freedom to shoot fireworks, also that the worse fireworks had been removed by the State. City Attorney Adam said a Fire Marshal has to be appointed if the City has the ordinance. Mayor Dixon asked Mr. Curtiss for a recommendation. He had none. Mr. Adam said he was for a restrictive but not a total prohibitive ordinance, that incidents, such as happened to C. W. Dunham could be punished under existing ordinances. He did/favor ordinances that could not be enforced as this one probably could not, and was against the minimum fine of \$25.00. He felt the people should be given a chance to police themselves before legislating against them. Miss de Geus said she was for an ordinance that would protect anyone with a complaint. She questioned the validity of the vote on the ordinance.

Mr. Adam made the motion, seconded by Mr. Curtiss, that Council cancel and annul Ordinance No. 68. The vote was as follows: Mr. Curtiss - Yes, Miss de Geus - No,; Mr. Willbern - No, Mr. Adam - Yes. Mayor Dixon cast the deciding vote of "Yes". Motion carried.

Mayor Dixon said he will ask Mr. Danes, Chairman of the Committee to work on the fireworks ordinance, to consider further some form of restrictive ordinance governing; times that would be acceptable and that could be enforceable. Miss de Geus said punishment for throwing fireworks from cars should be included. In regard to selling fireworks in the Village, the general opinion was that it would be alright.

Mr. Adam said the \$3.00 fee asked in County Clerk Bob Turrentine's letter does not pertain to Jersey Village. He said that an agenda should be posted three days before each meeting containing anything requiring a motion and vote.

Miss de Geus made the motion, seconded by Mr. Curtiss, and carried, that next month's date be changed from December 15, 1969 to December 8, 1969 at 7:30 PM because of the Christmas Holidays.

The Meeting adjourned on motion by Mr. Adam, seconded by Mr. Curtiss and carried at 9 PM.
