

Proper Debris Separation and Placement

Debris should be placed curbside, without blocking the roadway or storm drains.

VEGETATIVE DEBRIS

Leaves (do not put in bags), logs, plants, tree branches

2



CONSTRUCTION & DEMOLITION DEBRIS

Building materials, carpet, drywall, furniture, lumber, mattresses, plumbing

APPLIANCES & WHITE GOODS

Air conditioners, dishwashers, dryers, freezers, refrigerators, stoves, washers, water heaters

ELECTRONICS

Computers, radios, stereos, televisions, other devices with a cord

5



HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE

Cleaning supplies, batteries, lawn chemicals, oils, oil-based paints and stains, pesticides



NORMAL HOUSEHOLD TRASH

Normal household trash and bagged debris of any kind will not be picked up with debris as part of this program. You should continue to follow your normal garbage removal schedule.

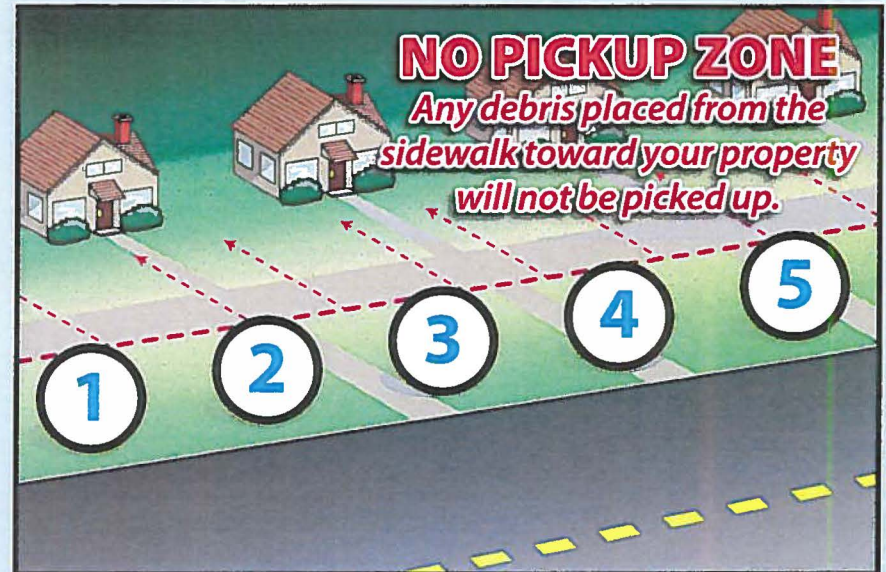
Do's and Don'ts

Do:

- Separate your debris according to category
- Make sure your debris is on the right-of-way or curbside
- Secure refrigerators and appliances

Don't:

- Stack debris against a fire hydrant, light pole, or utility box
- Mix household garbage or bagged debris with other types of debris
- Stack debris on the street more than 10 feet from the curb (toward your house)
- Block driveways or mailboxes

The Permits & Inspections Department of the City of Jersey Village; a sub-department of Public Works, will be issuing no-fee permits for any reconstruction, repairs, or new construction in the aftermath of the recent flooding event.

Staff would appreciate your assistance with accurately collecting data associated with this event, which FEMA requires. The Single-Family Residential inspections need only take 5 minutes, thereby allowing the Building Official to move on to the next structure, which will expedite permitting. Commercial inspections may take somewhat longer. The inspections should be conducted between the proximate hours of 9 – 11 AM and 1:30 – 3:30 PM, Monday through Friday – based on work-load and other commitments -- until all required structures have been inspected. The Building Official will also make rounds as part of ongoing damage assessment and may request home entry. The inspection request line is (713) 466-2138. Please provide address, name, contact info and AM or PM preference by 3 PM the day before the desired inspection.

Staff is here to assist you in determining whether a no-fee permit(s) are required and to facilitate any required rehabilitation of structures. The no-fee permit is required for your protection. The process will allow the city to insure your contractor is properly licensed for the work they are being paid to perform.

If temporary housing can be fulfilled via one's recreational vehicle, a no-fee permit may be issued by the Building Official, as per the City's Code of Ordinances, Sec. 14-88 (a) (27). The permit may be issued if the vehicle can be placed on a paved surface on private property and with appropriate electrical and sewer connections. The permit shall be valid for the period of time necessary to restore the residence to habitability, as determined by the building official, but not to exceed 120 days. Any extension to such permit will require approval of the building official and director of public works.

Debris removal is set for 05/02 and 05/23 for curbside removal.
