## FAQ's April 18th Flood

**Question**: Will there be pick up for heavy debris? (examples: tree limbs, carpet, furniture, ect...)

<u>Answer</u>: Yes, there will be two pick up days. Scheduled days are Monday, May 2<sup>nd</sup> and Monday, May 23<sup>rd</sup>..

**Question**: Who do I contact for flood damage assessment?

Answer: Please see contact building official, Christian Somers, CFM. 713-466-2106

**Question**: If I have damage to my home, does a contractor need a permit to do the work on the property?

<u>Answer</u>: Yes, please see letter of notice from the permits and inspections department posted on the city website.

Question: Is the water safe to drink?

**Answer:** Yes, the water is safe to drink.

**Question**: Are there any streets that are still flooded in Jersey Village?

**Answer**: No, all streets are safe to drive.

Question: If a group wants to come in and volunteer to help the community what do they need to do?

**Question**: If I live outside the city, who can I call to have debris removed?

**Question**: Why did you close the roads around the flooded areas?

<u>Answer</u>: This was done to improve access to our citizens and contractors who were having trouble accessing the area. This was also done as a safety precaution to prevent theft and solicitors from scouring the area.

<u>Answer</u>: We are making an assessment on a daily basis to determine what timeframe will be the most benefit to our citizens.
