On Wednesday, December 13, 2023, a significant milestone was reached as three Police Cadets successfully graduated from the Houston Community College Police Academy. This momentous occasion holds special significance for the



Jersey Village Police Department, marking the inaugural class of police cadets to be trained under its sponsorship.

Traditionally, an applicant would have to have their Texas Commission on Law Enforcement (TCOLE)



license as a police officer before we would hire them. This initiative aims to expand our pool of candidates, enabling us to identify and recruit the most qualified officers dedicated to serving our supportive and wonderful community.

Stop trying to be a "Hero" all the time and lower your score! Sometimes while playing we all see the "glass half full when probably the "glass is half empty"

- (1) Trying to believe you are going to hit the club 101% perfect when you are between clubs and have to choose.
- (2) Trying to hit through 10 trees when the chance of success is about 5%.
- (3) Trying to make a 30 foot downhill left to right putt.

  If these things go wrong, it can cost you a dozen or more strokes!

- (1) Choose the longer club selection and you are still good even if you only hit it 80%!
- (2) Punch the ball out to the fairway and take one more OR you might make a putt.

## **Jersey Meadow Clubhouse Construction Update**

The construction of the new clubhouse is progressing quickly with 90% of the outside complete. On the inside, all dry wall is installed and painted, the kitchen / bar equipment is installed, and all the tile and bathroom fixtures are complete. The new Simulator Hitting Bays are being installed now. Most of the concrete hardscape around the outside of the entire new building as well as all the stamped concrete for the large outside decks is complete. If all goes well, we hope to open the new

building by April 1. Renovations have already begun on the existing clubhouse. Accordingly, the pro shop and pro shop offices will only be accessible for 6-8 weeks. Nonetheless, operations for golf play in this location will still run; however, only packaged food and drinks will be available for golfers. Starting renovations of the old clubhouse now could shorten the project timeline by 5 to 6 weeks, potentially completing the entire facility by mid-summer. \*\*

Chief Riggs Retiring from Jersey Village Police Department

Chief Riggs embarked on his law enforcement journey in January of 1979. His career stared as a patrol officer in Dublin, Texas, before he joined the Farmers Branch Police Department on March 1, 1981. During his tenure of over two decades at the Farmers Branch Police Department, he steadily climbed the ranks, ultimately departing as a Deputy Chief in April 2006 to take the role of Assistant Chief for the Rockwall Police Department. After dedicating 13 years to

Rockwall, he was appointed as the Chief of Police in 2015.

Chief Riggs retired from the Rockwall PD in 2019 after a distinguished 40-year career in law enforcement. However, after a threemonth retirement period, he felt a strong desire to return to his noble profession and joined Strategic Resource Groups (SGR). SGR specializes in helping cities find interim police chiefs and manage the chief hiring process. Chief Riggs was chosen as the Interim Chief in November 2019 and was later appointed as the full-time chief on March 1, 2020 for the City of Jersey Village.

During his four and a half years of leadership, Chief Riggs made significant contributions. The department introduced several new initiatives, including a Chaplain program, a bike unit, a drone unit, body-worn cameras, a new Public Safety Software system, a 3D crime scene scanner, rifle plate carriers, ballistic helmets, department remodeling, and a refreshed brand with new vehicle graphics and badges.

He prioritized training for officers, offering programs such as the Police Executive Research Forum in Boston (PERF), the Leadership Command College (LCC) for command-level officers, FBI Law Enforcement Executive Development Association (FBI-LEEDA) for Supervisors, and continuous education courses for all officers.

Chief Riggs demonstrated his dedication by working patrol shifts during the day, night, and weekends, making him a well-known figure in the community. After an impressive 45-year career in law enforcement, he has decided to give retirement another shot. We extend our best wishes to him and his wife Jean of 32 years on their upcoming adventures!

# Tip of the Month: Warm up for Better Scores!

How many golfers race to the course, head to the 1st tee and then immediately tee off without warming up? The first 2 or 3 holes are a disaster but play is sometimes much better later on in the round. After the round, saying "man if I wouldn't have started triple, double, triple - I could have broken 90!" Always try to arrive 30-45 minutes before your tee time to warm up. A small bucket is fine (40-50 balls) and then spend 10 minutes on the putting green. Hit mostly short irons to start (8, 9 and wedges). Then finish up the last 10 balls with a couple of long irons and a few drivers. The greens can always be different speeds from day to day, so spend the last 10-15 minutes putting before teeing off to "get the speed down." Warm up before your tee time - it is a guarantee for a better score.



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## Jersey Village Achieves Significant Improvement in Flood **Insurance Rating**

Exciting news for the City of Jersey Village! The preliminary results from our latest Community Rating System (CRS) verification have arrived. After much effort and planning, Jersey Village is set to rise from a Class 7 to a Class 5 CRS rating, effective October 1, 2024.

## What this Means for Jersey Village

The improvement to a Class 5 rating in the CRS program brings tangible benefits to our residents in terms of flood insurance savings. This advancement reflects our commitment to enhancing public safety, reducing flood risks, and ultimately, lowering the cost of flood insurance for our community.

**Impact on Flood Insurance Discounts** -With the upgrade to a Class 5 rating, current discounts will increase substantially. Policies issued or renewed on or after October 1. 2024, will see discounts of 25% for properties in the Special Flood Hazard Area (SFHA) and a 10% discount for properties outside the SFHA.

Within the state of Texas, only 7 of the 71 CRS-participating communities have reached such classification. This achievement is a reflection of the hard work and dedication of our city staff, officials, and the community at large. We will keep working to maintain and improve our CRS rating, always with the goal of benefiting our community in meaningful ways. \*



#### **Know Your Flood Risk**

The City of Jersey Village wants to ensure that residents who have questions about flood risks, flood insurance, and retrofitting techniques, get answers in a timely manner. The Community Development Department is available to assist in the following areas: 1) Flood Insurance; 2) Flood Zone interpretation including base flood elevation and/or flood depth; 3) Additional FIRM information; 4) Problems not shown on FIRM; 5) Special flood related hazards; 6) Historical flood-related data; 7) Natural floodplain functions; and 8) Property protection measures. Please call the Community Development Office at (713) 464-2110 for more information.

You may also schedule a site visit to review flooding, drainage, and storm sewer problems, and to obtain advice on retrofitting techniques to provide additional protection. ### Jersey Village Residents,

We want to bring your attention to the necessity of Floodplain Development Permits for various property improvement projects, particularly for those within the Special Flood Hazard Area (SFHA). Please take note of the following key points:

- Floodplain Development Permit for any improvement: If you're planning any type of improvement, such as countertops, flooring, windows, or fixtures like sinks and lighting, within the SFHA, a Floodplain Development Permit is required. This step ensures that your improvements comply with regulations, contributing to the overall safety and resilience of our community.
- Combined Permits for Common Improvements: For projects categorized as improvements (e.g., upgraded AC units, adding storage buildings, patio cover additions), a floodplain review and permit will be combined in a single permit application. If you are undertaking exterior additions, like an outside Air Conditioning Condensing Unit (ACCU), elevation requirements will also be calculated by our dedicated staff.
- Exclusions for Repairs: Floodplain Development Permits are not required for repairs involving underground elements such as sewer repairs, gas repairs/tests, or any other non-equipment-related repairs. However, it's important to note that HVAC repairs fall under this exclusion only if the Air Conditioning Condensing Unit (ACCU) is not being replaced.
- Consultation for Other Improvements: For more extensive projects, including new structures, significant remodels, additions, or entirely new buildings, we strongly recommend a pre-development meeting or discussion with a code official. This proactive step ensures that your improvements meet both code and floodplain requirements.

Our goal is to foster a safe and resilient community, and adherence to these guidelines plays a crucial role in achieving this objective. Should you have any questions or require clarification on the permitting process, please don't hesitate to contact Community Development. Let's work together to continue building a Jersey Village that is resilient, compliant, and safe for all. \*



### **Charter Review Coming Soon - Volunteers Needed!**

Most residents are unfamiliar with the city's Home Rule Charter and the requirement to formally review this document every four years. The charter essentially works as the city's constitution. It establishes the basic template for governance within Jersey Village. Topics covered in the charter include election procedures, City Council powers, staff responsibilities, financial procedures, and the city's form of government.

A provision in the charter calls for a comprehensive review by a council-appointed commission. The commission

shall have seven members and three alternates, and serve for a period of six months. City Council will appoint members to the commission at its July Council Meeting. The deadline for applications is July 08, 2024. #### Strengthening Our Community: The Path to Police Recruitment and Retention

The Jersey Village Police Department is proud to welcome Officers Iris Ortiz, Rex McNeil, and Jacob Morgan to the department. These three seasoned professionals bring with them a combined experience of over thirty years of law enforcement experience. Their arrival comes at a crucial time, aligning with Chief Keele's primary mission since his appointment in February 2024: to achieve full staffing within the department. Today, the department stands just one officer short of that goal.

According to recent statistics, police departments across the United States are grappling with recruitment and retention challenges. A 2021 Police Executive Research Forum study highlighted a 45% increase in retirement rates and an 18% increase in resignations over the previous year, underscoring the growing difficulty of maintaining a full roster.

The reasons for these difficulties are comprehensive. Experts point to a combination of factors including heightened public scrutiny, challenging work conditions, and competitive alternatives in the private sector. Despite these hurdles, the importance of achieving a fully staffed police department cannot

be overstated. Full staffing not only enhances the department's ability to respond to emergencies but also allows for more community engagement and proactive policing efforts that can prevent crime and strengthen community relations.

c. Contractor identification signs. One non-illuminated temporary on-premises ground sign not exceeding four square feet in size shall be allowed for each contractor only during the period that the contractor is engaged in active construction, repair or maintenance of the premises. The sign may be located anywhere on the premises; provided, however, that such sign may not project beyond the property line and shall not be more than five feet in height above the average finished grade. No permit shall be required for the erection of such sign. \*\*

## Council Explores Options for Golf Course Bridge Closure and Traffic Solutions

At the April 2024 City Council meeting, discussions were held regarding the Golf Course Advisory Committee's recommendation to close the golf course bridge to vehicular traffic, leaving it open for golf carts, pedestrians, and bikers. While no immediate action was taken, the City Council directed the City Manager to explore alternatives, including extending Jersey Meadow Drive.

#### **Key Topics**

Some key topics presented to Council as part of the Council Staff Retreat Budget Memo include:

- Congo Lane Cost Reference: The Congo Lane rehabilitation project cost \$1,030 per linear foot. Using this for estimates, the city considered two main proposals:
- Extending Jersey Meadow Drive Across the Detention Pond: Estimated total cost of \$5,234,000, includes 1,750 feet of road and 200 feet of bridge. Benefits include potential water loop for Wyndham Village and a second access point.
- Following the Existing Right of Way: Estimated total cost of \$6,370,000,

includes 1,750 feet of road and 300 feet of bridge. This would involve less extensive county review.

#### **Other Considered Alternatives:**

- Extend Rio Grande: Connects Rio Grande Drive to Winchester Country. Estimated cost: \$1,000,000.
- Expand Village Drive: Widen to 33 feet during future replacement. Estimated cost: \$2,840,000.
- No Parking on Village Drive: Facilitate traffic flow but may be unpopular with residents.
- Two Right Turn Lanes on Village Green to Jones Road: Low cost, requires county coordination.

# City Accepts Parking Permit Applications Beginning August 1, 2024

In 1999 City Council passed an ordinance providing exceptions in the no parking/tow-away zones on your street. The ordinance established a permit system, which, upon application, issues two parking permits. A person may park a motor vehicle, which displays the issued permit, on the street in front of the address on the permit. The parking permit is issued annually upon application at no charge; however, replacement permits are \$25.00 each.

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#### CITY COUNCIL TAKES ACTION ON CITY POOL, GOLF COURSE BRIDGE, AND ENDORSES SUMMER CAMP

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### Beware of the Pig Butchering Scam: Protect Yourself from Financial Fraud

Have you ever received a text message intended for someone else? If so, you might have narrowly avoided falling victim to one of the newest and most insidious scams sweeping America: the "Pig Butchering" Scam. Named in reference to the practice of fattening a pig before slaughter, this deceptive scheme preys on people's desire for human connection, before it preys on people's trust and desire for quick and easy money, only to leave victims financially devastated.

The scam typically begins with unsolicited texts, emails, or social media messages, often from strangers or imposters posing as acquaintances. These individuals invest time in building rapport, sometimes over several weeks or even months, by discussing personal matters or even feigning romantic interest.

Once trust is established, the scammer introduces the idea of a lucrative

investment opportunity, often involving cryptocurrency. Victims are urged to invest quickly, with promises of high returns and minimal risk.

Other variations of these scams all have the same goal: Convince you to put your money toward the "opportunity" they shared. Since most of these scammers are overseas, they are seldom caught, and the victims almost never recover stolen funds.

To protect yourself from this scam, be skeptical, avoid clicking links, beware of gift card requests, seek advice before sharing personal or financial information, make your own investments, and minimize risks by never placing all of your funds in one investment.

In conclusion, staying informed and following these precautions, you can protect yourself from this new financial fraud.



#### **Matt's Tip of the Month**

Do you slice the ball? Sometimes, if you slice the ball it could be in your grip. Too weak (one or both hands turned too much counter clockwise to the clubface) can cause a slice or a ball that is always to the right. If this is you... try turning both your hands a little clockwise on the grip. This can help your hand (i.e. clubface) release sooner and get the clubface more square at impact. If your ball starts going a little too far left, then back off on the distance for clockwise hand position until you get a happy medium. Note: this is for righthanded golfers so opposite for left handles. ★

Its purpose is to increase the proficiency of judicial administrators and clerical personnel through education and the exchange of ideas. Founded in 1972, TCCA is an affiliate of the Texas Municipal League and offers its members a variety of services and programs.

TMCEC is a project of the Texas Municipal Courts Association and funded by a grant from the Texas Court of Criminal Appeals. TMCEC provides judicial and legal education for municipal judges, clerks and prosecutors through monthly regional seminars. TMCA is an association composed of municipal judges, clerks, prosecutors and court support personnel. It monitors legislation, attorney general opinions and changes in case law to ensure that the 918 municipal courts in Texas remain up-to-date on the law. ★

Solid waste and recycling services are provided to City residents through tax revenues.

The City currently contracts with GFL for solid waste and recycling services. Solid waste pick-up days are on Tuesday and Friday; recycling is picked-up on Wednesday. Please have waste/recycling ready for collection no later than 7:00 a.m. Heavy trash items can be picked up on waste collection Friday, however, these items are limited to one (1) heavy trash item per collection day.

#### **Bond Referendum on November Ballot**

During the August 2024 City Council Meeting, the City Council called a bond election for the November 2024 ballot. That election is to ask voters to vote on the issue of approving \$10,100,000 in debt for a new municipal pool complex.

That decision was made based upon the recommendation of the Bond Committee, a group of residents that was appointed by the City Council to look at options on how to handle the current pool that is approximately 50 years old. The Bond Committee ultimately recommended a new pool complex at an estimated cost of \$10,100,000.

If the bond were to pass, for a \$400,000 home with homestead exemptions for 2026 and 2027, the proposed tax rate increase would result in an additional \$11.67 per month compared to the 2025 tax amount. For homeowners with both homestead and over-65 exemptions, the increase would be approximately \$7.55 per month more than the 2025 tax amount.

#### Matt's Tip of the Month Warm up for Better Scores!

How many golfers race to the course, head to the 1st tee and then immediately tee off without warming up? The first 2 or 3 holes are a disaster. Sometimes playing so much better later in the round. After the round, saying; "man if I wouldn't have started triple, double, triple – I could have broken 90!" Always try to arrive 30-45 minutes before your tee time to warm up. A small bucket is fine (40-50 balls) and then spend 10 minutes on the putting green. Hit mostly short irons to start (8, 9 and wedges). Then finish the last 10 balls with a couple of long irons and a few drivers. The greens can always be different speeds from day to day, so spend the last 10-15 minutes putting before teeing off to "get the speed down." Warm up before your tee time – it is a guarantee for a better score.

#### **Crime Prevention Tips for Reducing Burglary of Motor Vehicles**



#### Matt's Tip of the Month Balance for Better Contact

You can have the prettiest swing ever, but if you do not hit the shot "solid", it doesn't' matter. I have seen many swings that were not very good, but they work. This is because the golfer maintains balance throughout the entire swing. This will ensure better contact of the ball. There is no substitute for solidness of contact in your shot. You must have perfect balance throughout the entire swing to hit the ball consistently. One drill I used for many years back in my playing days was swinging with my eyes closed. Hold the club approx. 6" off the ground; get your normal address position and make a full swing. Swing it 20% harder than your normal speed. Maintain your balance each time. If you would literally do just 25 of those a day (175 per week - 9125 per year!) I promise; you would be a better golfer. ★

A study by the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission suggests that 85 percent of candle fires could be avoided if consumers followed three basic safety rules:

- Never leave a burning candle unattended.
- Never burn a candle on or near anything that might catch fire.
- Keep candles out of the reach of children and pets.

#### While Burning:

- Never leave a candle unattended.
- Never burn a candle on or near anything that can catch fire.

- Keep candles out of the reach of children and pets.
- Never touch or move a candle while it is burning or while the wax is liquefied.
- Don't burn a candle all the way down.
- Place burning candles at least three inches apart from one another.
- Extinguish a candle if the flame becomes too high or flickers repeatedly.
- Never use a candle as a night light or while you may fall asleep.
- Be very careful if using candles during a power outage. Flashlights and other battery-powered lights are safer sources of light during a power failure.

#### City Population Update: Jersey Village Estimated at 7,925 as of July 1, 2024

In an official update, the latest population estimate for Jersey Village is 7,925 as of July 1, 2024 (demographics. texas.gov/Estimates/2023/). This revised number reflects an increase from the earlier draft estimates. To ensure accuracy, city staff worked closely with officials from the state demographer's office, reviewing data thoroughly to provide the most precise estimate. For reference, the population recorded in the official 2020 census was 7,921. Accurate population estimates are vital as they directly

influence the city's planning and funding allocations. These figures help Jersey Village secure appropriate state and federal funding, guide infrastructure projects, and plan for the services needed to support our residents. Maintaining updated and accurate population data also aids in long-term strategic planning, ensuring that the city can meet the community's needs as it grows and changes. \*\*






#### Matt's Tip of the Month Balance for Better Contact

You can have the prettiest swing ever, but if you do not hit the shot "solid", it doesn't matter. I have seen many swings that were not very good, but they work. They work, because the golfer maintains balance throughout the entire swing. This will ensure better contact of the ball. There is no substitute for solidness of contact in your shot. You must have perfect balance throughout the entire swing to hit the ball consistently. One drill I used for many years back in my playing days was making swings with my eyes closed. Hold the club approx. 6" off the ground; get your normal address position and make a full swing. Swing it 20% harder than your normal speed. Maintain your balance each time. If you would literally do just 25 of those a day (175 per week - 9125 per year!) I promise; you would be a better golfer. ★
