Project Update

The City of Jersey Village Long-term Flood Recovery Plan project is on schedule, and the project team continues to make progress towards the end goal – a hydraulically, economically, environmentally, and socially feasible Long-term Flood Recovery Plan for the City of Jersey Village. The project team has completed or continued work as scheduled on several items mentioned in the project update from January 20, 2017 including:

- The Rapid Assessment (Structural Inventory) of homes in the floodplain is complete and under review by the City.
- Existing conditions hydrologic and hydraulic modeling and calibration to the April 18, 2016 Tax Day Flood are complete and under review by the City.
- Analysis of alternatives has begun and will be ongoing for the next few months.
- Preliminary identification of candidates for non-structural alternatives is complete. Further refinement of candidates will be complete following the development of structural alternatives.
- The preliminary environmental desktop review has been completed.
- The Project Team is preparing for the second public meeting to be held on March 23, 2017.

Other tasks are not yet underway, such as the economic analysis, preferred alternative finalization, and the final environmental review.

The next project update will be posted in March 2017. Updates for the project will be posted monthly until the publication of the final plan.
